EPISODE FIVE: Working with Words – Simon Stephens with Juliet Stevenson

**GOAL:** Stimulate your imagination with this practical exercise.

**SUPPLIES:** A script of your choice.

**EXERCISE:** Using the script as a guide, add information to your character backstory. Answer as many questions as you can about moments the audience does not see. Questions you could use include:

- Where has your character just come from?
- What mood are they in?
- What do they expect when they come into the scene?
- What time of day is it?

**JULIET SAYS:** Fill your character's imagination with detail so that you really know them, enabling you to walk on stage and just play.
