EXTENSION QUESTIONS:

- "The idea isn't the play"
 Discuss what this statement by Willy Russell means.
- 2. What role does 'having the idea' play in creating the text? Describe how a writer's imagination may be triggered and how they turn this into the text.
- 3. Is there ever a useful balance between documentary and fiction? Discuss the range of experiences that are useful for a writer to draw upon when creating a play for the stage.
- **4.** "In many ways, you are both the 'Master of' and 'Slave to' your writing. It can't be controlled."

 Describe what Willy Russell means by this statement.
- **5.** Shirley Valentine, Educating Rita, Blood Brothers... Discuss the commonality in these plays. Is it only ever one play in many guises? Why do writers return to certain themes?
- 6. "You should be able to describe it in a minute" says Willy Russell.

 Try and describe an idea for a play in 60 seconds that you would like to develop.
- 7. "Never be frightened to get it wrong."

 Why does Willy Russell believe that this adds value to the creative process?
