GOAL: Add depth to your characters with this practical exercise.

SUPPLIES: Pen and paper.

EXERCISE: Write down everything you know about your own name. Consider questions like:

- What does your name mean?
- What is the history of your name?
- Who named you?
- How does your name make you feel?
- Do you have any nicknames?

TANIKA SAYS: A name can illuminate narrative. Once you have completed the exercise with your own name, do it with the names of your characters. Do their narratives change? What have you learned about them that you did not know before?

- 6. Describe how language is physical and how this enhances meaning.
- 7. What contribution can a pause or silence bring to a scene and why?
