Using these resources together has the potential to enable a 360-degree learning experience, whereby students can see the staged outcome whilst getting an insight into characters, themes and language of the text.

Give younger students a way into Shakespeare's canon with this abridged version of one of his most farcical comedies, <u>The Comedy of Errors</u>. Devised specifically for schools and families by the Royal Shakespeare Company in collaboration with Told by an Idiot, this adaptation uses a pared down script, props, live music and physical comedy to convey the story.
